




Wick St Fergus Church of Scotland

Welcome to May. As I write this, looking out of the manse study window over the Glebe and the wonders of nature, as I observe the birds flying about while they seek material for their nests it sets the mind to thinking and contemplation. The thought uppermost in my mind is, "WHAT IS UP WITH THE WEATHER?" I mean, come on, it's the end of April, for goodness sake! We shouldn't be having sleet showers at this time of year! It's bizarre! And it gets worse!

This sets me off on a stream of consciousness. It goes something like this: why on earth did that referee give a penalty in that Celtic versus Ross County game? And why were there no Tunnock's Teacakes[®] in Wetherspoons this week? And why do people park so bizarrely on Macarthur Street? What is the purpose of Irish country music? How many angels can dance on the head of a tack? It's not that I am obsessive or anything like that, but these things concern me and keep me awake at night with righteous anger. Actually, I am winding you all up. These things, at the end of the day, don't amount to a hill of beans when compared to what is really important like justice, inclusion, peace (with others and with God), caring for one another, welcoming others, the economy and how the poor are created and treated by those who should know better.

There are many more issues. They are what should occupy us. The Bible has a lot to say about this sort of thing. In St Matthew's Gospel my real boss has some important things to say about all of this. In chapter 25 Jesus speaks of the final judgment of all things. But the measure of what is going to be important is not anything petty or obscure. Far from it.

The measure against how people will be judged is not some obscure theological concern which has the appearance of divinity but which actually denies and opposes God's intentions for his world. The judge looks at the unco guid (those who thought that they had their feet under God's table) and then he looks at those to his right and says to the unco guid: "In as much as you have not done it to the least of these, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS, you have not done it to me." What is important is NOT my personal salvation or having Jesus as my personal saviour, phrases that are never used in the Bible by Jesus or anybody.

Our devotion to God is seen in our devotion to what is truly important to him, issues such as justice, grace, love, fairness, equality, elimination of poverty caused so that others can live in privilege. Don't be diverted by religious niceties. When candidates in the coming council elections come to your door or when they come up to you in the street don't be satisfied if they are answering questions which you have not asked. Don't be diverted by personal attacks on other political personalities or philosophies. Ask your canvasser: what will your people do about unemployment in our town, how will you support our health service provision, what have your folk done about this up to now IN OUR AREA?

What is truly important to us will be seen in how we act. This is true for citizens and with those who claim or would seek to represent them. Don't be satisfied with petty concerns. Don't be fobbed off with pat answers. Examine yourself. Examine our town and county. Examine them. At Wick St Fergus we take our parish responsibilities very seriously. Stop me in the street or come and see us and ask questions. You know where we are.




